

Poison - Plants



1

Try to identify the toxic substance collect any samples and check for distinctive odors



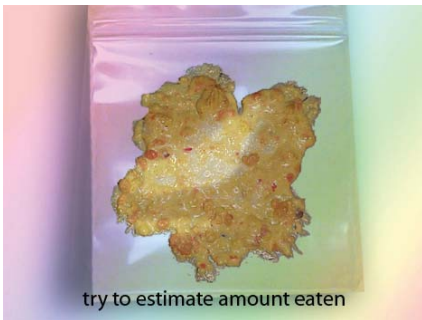

Look for traces in or around the mouth to identify the substance



3

If your cat vomits, note carefully the appearance of the vomit and collect them in a plastic baggy for identification



try to estimate amount eaten

4

Try to estimate the amount that the pet has eaten. Some things are only toxic in large doses



5

Rinse out the mouth with water

6

Call the ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center hotline which operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, at (888) 426-4435 there is a \$60 consultation fee, payable by credit card, for this service and this includes ALL follow-up consultations should you or your vet need further assistance with your pet's case



DO NOT induce vomiting unless stated by the ASPCA poison control or your vet



If your animal is having seizures, losing consciousness, is unconscious or is having difficulty breathing, telephone ahead and bring your pet immediately to your local veterinarian or emergency veterinary clinic



Note any symptoms that your pet may be having
